Graham McKenzie

Graham has been a greatly valued Trust Board Member since 2000. As a community representative, he has brought a wealth of business acumen to the Trust Board, acquired over 30 years as a Barrister & Solicitor. During his tenure on the Board, Saint Kentigern has undergone a period of unprecedented expansion including the introduction of girls to the College campus in 2003, the merger with the Corran School Trust Board in 2009 and the opening of a Preschool on the Girls' campus in 2011. Murray has many interests but enjoys spending the majority of his spare time with his family. He endeavours to keep physically fit and has run four half marathons in recent years. In 2010, he organised a team of 15 to trek to Base Camp Everest in Nepal and earlier this year, completed the Technical Mountaineering Course run by New Zealand Alpine Guides in Mt Cook. He is looking forward to experiencing more of New Zealand's great outdoors with his family as his boys get a bit older.
