North Island Water Polo Championships

The NISS Water Polo Championships in Wellington indicated how the sport is growing. There were 13 boys' teams and 16 girls' teams from around the North Island. Our girl's team won 5 of their 6 games and placed 5th overall. This is I believe, their best result ever. Their only loss was to Diocesan A who placed 4th overall.

The boy's team drew 1 and lost 5 games but still placed 8th overall. We only lost 9-12 to Rangitoto who placed 2nd and lost 12-14 to Westlake who were 3rd overall. They scored 54 goals and conceded 67. It was stated by a few people that Saint Kentigern cannot be taken lightly at the Nationals in a few weeks time.

NZ Rowing Championships

With the cancellation of the 2020 NZ Secondary Schools Rowing Championships as well as the North Island Secondary School Championships this year, it was decided that Saint Kentigern College would take the whole rowing squad down to Karapiro to compete in the end of season Maadi Cup Championship Regatta. Royal New Zealand Ballet

At the end of last year Mr Wilcox worked with two of our dance students Lukas Maher and Joshua Douglas towards submitting their applications to the Royal New Zealand Ballet to be a part of the RNZB Mentor Programme. Hundreds of aspiring young dancers applied across New Zealand. Both Josh and Lukas were accepted along with 22 other aspiring young dancers.

The mentoring programme offers committed and aspiring young dancers to be mentored by the Royal New Zealand Ballet dancers and Artistic Team, spend time with them during each season and get an inside experience of life as a professional dancer. This is a one-year programme and students accepted into this programme complete the following:

- watch an RNZB company class
- observe rehearsals conducted by RNZB Artistic staff
- spend time backstage during productions
- receive two complimentary tickets to selected performances
- spend one-on-one time with RNZB dancers/mentors throughout the year
- participate in exclusive master classes
- spend two days in Wellington at the RNZB's home to observe company class and rehearsals, take part in activities such as classes and workshops and be immersed in all aspect of the professional dancer's life, including visits to the costume shop
