This pānui is to highlight key events that have occurred this Term, as well as looking forward to what is ahead at Saint Kentigern College; including our first Māori whānau hui which will be held in Term Three. HIGHLIGHTS:

Prefect Commissioning

This was a beautiful occasion blending Saint Kentigern's unique Scottish culture with tikanga Māori. This included a karanga (led by Whaea Jasmine Martin and Ocean Scott), mihi whakatau by Dontae Russo-Nance, an opening karakia in te reo Māori and the presentation of korowai to Ocean and Dontae as the 2022 Te Amokura Prefects. The ceremony was a fantastic celebration of all our school leaders and featured many of our ākonga Māori. The event concluded with the prefects being bagpiped out of the Chapel and kai in the Goodfellow Centre. It was great to finally be able to acknowledge these leaders, in what was the first opportunity to gather with whānau since last year's Covid-19 lockdown. We look forward to seeing them grow within these responsibilities throughout the academic year.

Māori & Pasifika Assembly

We were able to hold our first assembly for Māori and Pasifika students. This featured the celebration of our 2022 Māori and Pasifika school leaders and the presentation of our Te Amokura Council.
