IB and NCEA Practice Examinations

Starting on Tuesday 13 September and finishing on Friday 23 September, our IB and NCEA Practice Examinations will be taking place. These examinations should reveal genuine misunderstandings, or gaps in knowledge - not a lack of preparation. In many cases, the school's Practice Examinations are Derived Grade Examinations. This means the grades act as 'predicted grades' if a student is absent at the end of the year. Considering the current climate, it is crucial for all students to attend their examinations.
