Design Categories for 2012 Year 7 and 8

Illumination Illusion section

This section has no theme boundaries giving the designer complete freedom in his/her design. The designer is to create a work of art in another dimension that glows under ultra violet light. UV garments must be worn on the body and not just hand held. All forms of lighting on garments are acceptable.



Kiwiana and Pacifica

Students are to gather inspiration from New Zealand's rich Maori Culture or other cultures of our South Pacific neighbours.

Celebrate what it is like to live in New Zealand and the South Pacific – the sea, beach, flora, fauna, birds, insects and the wide and wonderful personalities of our unique cultures.

A Man's World

This section is a completely 'men' only section. No girls allowed! Within this section, the boys of Year 7 and 8 have a chance to portray anything 'bloke-like' in a design. Their design must use creativity and innovation.



Magic and Love of Books

Use your favourite story to inspire a design based on the history, art, story, setting or characters of your most treasured story or tale – let your imagination go wild!

The Mad Hatter's Hat and Fascinator Frenzy

Design either a creative hat or fascinator. This section has no boundaries and gives the designer complete freedom in concept, construction and materials. This section encourages a high degree of originality and innovation.



Pre-loved Avant Garde

This section allows the designer to create a wearable art item using pre-loved/second hand materials. It allows the designer to create an outfit that is extravagant, extrovert yet stylish. It can be driven by dreams and fantasies.

Requirements of Wearable Art Garments:

- Designed to be showcased on the catwalk.
- Each designer needs to organise his/her own model to be available for both the rehearsal and the show.
- Durable enough to be worn a number of times.
- Parental assistance is permissible but the main ideas and production must be the student's own work.

Judging Criteria:

There will be awards for each category and also an overall supreme award. There will also be some highly commended prizes!

Independent external judges will be adjudicating the event.

This is what our judges will be looking for.

- Creativity, zest and innovation
- How well the garment represents the category requirements
- Overall originality
- Overall presentation and construction of design
