## **Years 7-13 Subject Learning Conferences**

We are looking forward to having you on campus for our first Student Learning Conferences event on **Thursday 4 May** between **1:30pm and 6:30pm**.

Further Subject Learning Conferences will take place in Term Three across two evenings, one for students in Years 7-10 and a separate event for students in Years 11-13.

While we do our best to be available to you, there are limited appointment slots for each of our teaching staff. We would encourage you to engage with comments and feedback already published on the OLE as the best way to stay up to date with your child's learning progression.

We encourage a learning conference rather than a parent/teacher style interview to help promote learning partnership between the school, parents, and the student. Where appropriate, we recommend that students attend with their parents as this encourages shared decision-making, good communication, and clearer learning expectations with the student. The best outcomes for students are assisted by these sorts of strong connections. Students are not required to wear uniform when attending.

An email will be sent on the morning of **Thursday 27 April** to indicate that bookings are open with a personalised link to click. Bookings will be made via the SchoolPoint programme.

If for any reason you are unable to attend the Subject Learning Conferences on the allocated afternoon, and you are concerned about your child's progress, please email the subject teacher.

## **Subject Learning Conference Locations and Duration**

- Year 7 Subject Learning Conferences will be held in EMC and will be 12 minutes long with their form teacher only.
- Year 8-13 conferences are 6 minutes long and will be held predominantly across the Goodfellow and Macky classrooms. A further updated list of classrooms will be made available on the OLE prior to the event so please ensure you check this. Maps and teacher locations will also be handed out on the day.
- Please dress warmly as you will need to travel between buildings.

It is important that everyone adheres to the appointment times. If you wish to have a longer discussion, please contact the subject teacher directly to make another time at a later date.

For the Subject Learning Conferences on Thursday 4 May:

- School will finish at 12:30pm.
- Saint Kentigern buses home have been organised for a 12:30pm finish and late winter buses will not run on this day.
