#### **Registration and Payment for the Award**

Registration and Payment for the Award is directly through the DOE website - not the College. The College is an approved Award Centre – we administer the Award on behalf of the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Programme. Being an external Award, means it is a student driven Award. Students must demonstrate commitment and organisation to successfully achieve the award, it is not the responsibility of the College Staff to ensure its completion. However, the College does have an expectation that the Bronze Award will be completed by the set date, if the students want to progress into the Silver Award the following year.

To be able to attend the Practice Journey, students must have:

- Attended a training day
- Correctly set up their Physical Recreation, Service and Skill components including their Assessors on the ORB (Online Record Book)

#### **Overview of the Award**

This is a student driven award where your child will be required to be organised, proactive and independent in all aspects. The award consists of 3 activity components – Physical Recreation, Skill and Service. One of these components is to be chosen as a major and be completed over a 6-month period and complete 26 hours. The minor components are to be completed over a 3-month period and 13 hours. Please note that only 1 hour per week can be logged on the Online Record Book (ORB). This means even if a student does 3 hours of service in one week, they can only log one hour. This is designed so the students do not over commit and can maintain balance in their schedules.

Students are required to work in their own time towards completing their Physical Recreation, Service and Skills components throughout the year. The expectation for these is that they set a specific goal and then some form of improvement is shown over the time period. Each of these components will have an Assessor who will determine if they have met the requirement and achieved the correct number of hours and weeks (see the Bronze DOE OLE page for more details). This Assessor is the person who will oversee your child such as a sports coach; it cannot be a family member. For all other queries your child's Award Leader (Teacher assigned to them to monitor their ORB progress) is their first port of call.

The award also consists of two Adventurous Journeys. A **practice** journey and a **qualifying** journey. To prepare for the practice journey we will run a training day at the college. The Practice Journey is an overnight Hike. The Qualifying Journey is built into Field Centre (Year 10 Camp at the end of the year).

# **Important Dates:**

Training Day – students choose one day to attend.

Saturday 1 March or Sunday 2 March

**Practice Journeys** – students **choose one journey** to attend.

Trip 1: Friday 4 & Saturday 5 April

Trip 2: Sunday 6 & Monday 7 April

Trip 3: Friday 2 & Saturday 3 May

Trip 4: Sunday 4 & Monday 5 May

We will be heading to Hunua Regional Park via Buses and camping overnight at the Upper Mangatawhiri Campsite.

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Further Trip information will come out closer to the time.

The Qualifying Journey will be incorporated into Field Centre for 2025.

#### **Further Information**

Each student must have the following for Practice and Qualifying Journeys:

- Sleeping Bag
- Waterproof Jacket and over trousers
- Tramping Boots, Tramping socks
- Tramping pack 60 65L and pack liner
- Sleeping mat
- Water bottle
- Food (Students bring their own)
- Torch
- Bowl/ Mug/Plate/Cutlery
- Toiletries
- Tramping Clothes (no cotton t-shirts or hoodies)
- Thermals Polypropylene or Merino
- Cooker, gas and billy (can have 1 between 2 students)

Tents will be provided by the College.

The total cost for the Training Day and Practice Journey is \$120. This will be charged to your College account after the completion of the Practice Journey's.
